Speaker biographies

Professor Neil Greenberg

Professor of Defence Mental Health, King's College London and March on Stress

Professor Neil Greenberg is a consultant academic, occupational and forensic psychiatrist based at King's College London. Neil served in the United Kingdom Armed Forces for more than 23 years and has deployed, as a psychiatrist and researcher, to a number of hostile environments including Afghanistan and Iraq.

At King's Neil leads on a number of military mental health projects and is a principal investigator within a nationally funded Health Protection Research unit. He is a past chair of the Royal College of Psychiatrists (RCP) Special Interest Group in Occupational Psychiatry and is leading the World Psychiatric Association position statement on mental health in the workplace.

Neil has published more than 300 scientific papers and book chapters and has been the Secretary of the European Society for Traumatic Stress Studies, the President of the UK Psychological Trauma Society and Specialist Advisor to the House of Commons Defence Select Committee.

During the COVID19 pandemic, Neil worked closely with various government organisations and published widely on psychological support for healthcare, and other key workers. As well as running March on Stress Ltd, a psychological health consultancy, Neil also is a trustee with the Society and Faculty of Occupational Medicine and is part of NHS England's expert reference group on staff wellbeing.

Baroness Eluned Morgan MS

Minister for Health and Social Services

Eluned Morgan was born in 1967 in Ely, Cardiff. She was educated at Glantaf Welsh language comprehensive school. She won a scholarship to the United World College of the Atlantic and gained a degree in European Studies from the University of Hull. She formerly worked as a researcher for S4C, Agenda TV and the BBC.

Eluned's political career started at the age of 27 when she was elected as the youngest Member of the European Parliament in 1994. She was only the fifth woman elected to a full time political



position in the history of Wales, and the first full time politician in Wales to have a baby whilst in office. She represented Wales for the Labour Party from 1994-2009. In this role she became the Labour spokesperson on industry, science and energy and spokesperson for the 200 strong Socialist Group on Budget Control matters. She authored the Green Paper on energy on behalf of the EP and led the Parliament's discussions on the Electricity Directive where she ensured new rights for consumers and demanded that Member States of the EU addressed the issue of fuel poverty.

From late 2009 until July 2013 she worked as the Director of National Business Development in Wales for SSE (SWALEC) one of the UK's largest energy companies. During 2013 -2016, Eluned Morgan served as the Shadow Minister for Wales in the House of Lords, and from 2014-2016 she served as Shadow Minister for Foreign Affairs. She was granted a peerage in 2011 and is formally known as Baroness Morgan of Ely.

Eluned Morgan was elected to the National Assembly in May 2016 as regional member for Mid & West Wales. In November 2017 Eluned was appointed Minister for Welsh Language and Lifelong Learning. On 13 December 2018 she was appointed Minister for International Relations and the Welsh Language. Eluned was appointed Minister for Health and Social Services on 13 May 2021.

Chief Executive, Healthcare Inspectorate Wales

Alun joined Healthcare Inspectorate Wales in April 2014 and led the organisation as Interim Chief Executive during the Covid-19 pandemic, one of the most challenging periods for healthcare in recent history. Alun was appointed as HIW's permanent Chief Executive in July 2022.

Alun is from Wales and has over 25 years of experience working in audit, inspection and regulation. He has previously worked for the Audit Commission, the Healthcare Commission and the Care Quality Commission (CQC), where he led CQC's contribution to the Mid Staffs Public Inquiry.

Alun intends to continue developing the strong foundations and collaborative style built by HIW over recent years, leading the organisation as it seeks to deliver its goal of influencing standards and driving improvement in the healthcare system.

He has completed a Masters in medical education and recently was awarded the national Munro Medal by the RCP for excellence and leadership in education.

Henry was listed in the Guru Radar of the Thinkers 50 list of the most influential business thinkers in the world.
