Who are they?

The Healthcare Quality Improvement Partnership (HQIP) was established in 2008 to promote **quality in healthcare**, and **increase the impact that clinical audit has on healthcare quality improvement**. It is an independent organisation led by the Academy of Royal Medical Colleges, The Royal College of Nursing and National Voices.

What do they do?

HQIP aims to improve health outcomes by enabling those who commission, deliver and receive healthcare to **measure and improve our healthcare services**. HQIP works in partnership with patients and healthcare professionals to **influence and improve healthcare practice** at all levels. HQIP **commissions, manages and develops** national programmes of quality improvement on behalf of NHS England and other healthcare departments and organisations, along with guidance and resources for local quality improvement. This includes:



The National Clinical Audit and Clinical Outcome Reviews Programme (NCAPOP):

commissioning, management and development of the **national audit programme**. Stimulating improvement in safety and effectiveness by enabling clinicians, managers and policy makers to **learn from adverse events** and other relevant data.

Clinical Service Accreditation:

Influencing, negotiating and supporting leaders and clinicians to adopt clinical service accreditation methods using tools produced by the <u>Clinical</u> Service Accreditation Alliance.



Clinical Outcomes Publication:

an initiative to publish quality measures at the level of individual consultant, team and unit level using national clinical audit data. The data is presented through NHS MyNHS. National Choices and **Benchmarking:** Clinical Audit providing a visual snapshot of individual Trust audit data set against individual national benchmarks.



The National Joint Registry:

monitoring the performance of joint replacement implants and the effectiveness of different types of surgery.
