



Health Select Committee

Who are they?

A great deal of the work of Parliament takes place in committees, which examine wide ranging issues and scrutinise the work of the government. There is a **Commons Select Committee** for every government department, each of which typically has eleven members, including the Chair. The Health Committee is appointed by the House of Commons to scrutinise the policy, spending and administration of the **Department of Health and its associated public bodies**.

What do they do?

In order to achieve its aim, the committee carries out a number of different types of work, including:

Inquiries



The Committee chooses its own line of inquiry and will then **gather written and oral evidence**. Depending on its scope, an inquiry may consist of a single oral evidence session, or may continue for several months, and the committee can also choose to conduct visits. Inquiry findings are reported to the Commons, printed, and **published on the Parliament website** and the government then, generally, has **60 days** to respond to the recommendations.

Pre appointment hearings

Pre-appointment hearings are held in public and enable the committee to take evidence from the candidate for a key public position, before they are appointed to the role. Following the session, the committee will publish a report setting out its views on the suitability of the candidate. This report is non-binding, but will be considered by government ahead of the appointment.



Correspondence



In its role examining issues relating to the Department of Health and its associated bodies, the committee **receives and responds to correspondence** from a range of sources, including members of the public, health-related organisations and Ministers.
