



# **National Audit Office**

## Who are they?

The National Audit Office (NAO)'s role is to scrutinise public spending for Parliament. It has existed in its present form since it was established in the National Audit Act 1983 and is led by the **Comptroller and Auditor General** (C&AG), who is an officer of the House of Commons. It has statutory access rights and is totally **independent** of government. The **Committee of Public Accounts (PAC)** at Parliament uses their reports to hold government to account for how it spends public money.

### What do they do?

The NAO scrutinises public spending for Parliament to help the government in its drive to improve public services, nationally and locally and its work includes the following:



#### Financial Audits

The NAO carries out **financial audits** for all central government departments, agencies and other public sector bodies, and reports the results to Parliament.

#### Value for money studies

The NAO defines good value for money as 'the **optimal use of resources to achieve the intended outcomes'** and carries out studies in order to form a judgement as to whether this has been achieved in government expenditure. These reports assist Parliament in **holding the government to account** for how it spends public money.



#### Local audit

The C&AG is responsible for preparing and issuing the **Code of Audit Practice**, which sets out what local auditors are required to do.

#### Investigations

The NAO conducts **investigations based on concerns** raised with the organisation, or issues which arise through other pieces of work. Such work is designed to be rapid, responsive and to establish the facts of the situation.



#### Support to Parliament

In addition to supporting the PAC, the NAO offers its services to Parliament more widely, supporting other select committees, as well as individual MPs, in **scrutinising government departments** and public spending.



#### International activities

The NAO plays an international role as the Supreme Audit Institution (SAI) of the United Kingdom and the C&AG is the appointed **external auditor for a number of international bodies**.
