## What do they do?

The RCR supports clinical radiologists and clinical oncologists throughout their training and their careers. It encourages development of these two specialities and public awareness of the surrounding issues. It endeavours to maintain highest professional competence and practice in both specialities and strives to promote study and research in related subjects.



**Training:** Maintains and reviews the postgraduate training curricula for both specialities, ensuring the quality of training.



**FRCR examination**: Conducts and develops examinations for both specialities.



**Development of service and workforce**: Supports the workforce in clinical radiology and clinical oncology for the benefit of patients, highlighting workforce gaps.







Influence and public education: Seeks to influence standards and national policy. Informs patients on related issues.

Research, Quality improvement and Audit: Encourages improving practice for patients through delivery and support of research, audit and quality improvement projects.

Maintains standards for the profession: Supports the process of revalidation through guidelines and a professional development scheme.
